## **The Vision of God. . . the Grace of God at Work** **The Fourth Street Health Clinic Opens**

One of the greatest privileges of being a pastor is watching God at work. Over three years ago, God gave me the vision to establish a free community health center. Others in the area had received that vision even before I did. Prayer and many discussions were the initial avenues of work on the project. Soon, many things began to fall right into place. One of the first things was the building. A family donated an old house to Urban Mission. It was in need of major repairs in order to be used. Many thought the house should be torn down but God had other plans.

After securing the building, the City of Steubenville encouraged me to apply for block grant funding to begin the rehabilitation process on the property. The application was successful and \$130,000 made the facility weather tight. After that, the process continued and many meetings followed.

Last May, I was driving up Sunset Boulevard in Steubenville and I received back-to-back phone calls on my cell phone. Both of the people calling offered \$25,000 each for rehabilitation and construction work for the health clinic. The funds were unsolicited. At this point, it was very clear that God wanted the health center established for the poor.

As time went on, a friend called to introduce me to individuals who also wanted to start the health center. We visited an existing health center in Warren, Ohio. After that, we began working very hard to see this happen in Steubenville. It was not an easy task but God always provided what we needed at exactly the right time. Donations were offered, people volunteered and soon, 60 different organizations had involved themselves in establishing the health center.

In early March, the vision of God came to fruition. A ribbon cutting and open house ceremony was held on March 10, 2006. Within the next week, the first patients were seen. Now we offer basic primary care, much like a doctors office. We still need doctors, nurses and funding. Soon we will finish the rehabilitation work and offer a dental center and other healthcare opportunities.

Though much hard work went into this project, we all realize that none of us worked hard enough for this to happen as it well as it has. ONLY God’s will and grace could open this health center. It took the work of this entire community and only God could bring about such a united front. God gave the vision, supplied the funds, the property, the people and revealed the Amazing Grace of God for the poor.

The Vision of God is still unfulfilled in my heart. There is still much yet to be done. But there is also much to celebrate. Thank God for you, who support the work of God through Urban Mission. Thank God for all the people, organizations and institutions who became the hands and feet of God. Praise God for the great things that are to come!

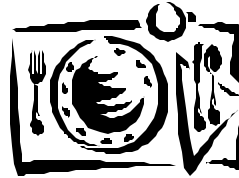
## End Hunger in the Valley

## Parish Nurse News: April is Alcohol Awareness Month

Alcoholic beverages have been around for a long time. Ancient civilizations learned to make alcoholic beverages. These beverages have been consumed with meals, at social gathering and even at religious celebrations. Although alcoholic beverages are common, consumption of alcohol is responsible for many problems. Let's look at some of those problems.

Persons can become addicted to alcoholic beverages. There are actual changes that take place in a person's nervous system when he/she becomes addicted to alcohol. Alcohol addiction can lead to such things as job loss, violence, and health problems. Some research has shown that alcohol addiction runs in families.

Another problem with alcohol is teenage drinking, especially binge drinking. Every year there are stories about young persons who died after

binge drinking. Binge drinking involves drinking a large amount of alcohol over a very short period of time. The alcohol acts as a poison in the person's body and the person can die. In many of these cases, friends thought that the person was just sleeping off the alcohol, but the person was actually in a coma. We need to educate young people about the dangers of alcohol, especially binge drinking.

An additional problem with drinking alcohol is driving under the influence. Every year many people are killed by drunk drivers. Alcohol depresses the central nervous system, which slows the person's reactions and also alters his perceptions. Persons under the influence of alcohol cannot drive safely.

Be safe. Educate yourself about the dangers of alcohol, so that you can protect yourself and others.
